2. <u>Publication Schedule</u>

Volume 72.1-2 is in production and will contain 9 articles and 17 reviews. 2 articles are written by women, 1 is in French, and 3 are by scholars at Canadian universities.

2.1 Submissions

In the past year (since the May 2018 meeting), *Phoenix* has received 54 submissions (past years: 2018: 70; 2017: 76; 2016: 65; 2015: 41; 2014: 55).

3. <u>Report of the Review Editors</u>

3.1 Phoenix, vol. 71.3-4

This issue was published last year, including 15 reviews that cover the following areas: Greek literature (3); Greek history (4); Roman literature (3); Roman history (4); Material culture (1)

Among the authors and editors of the books reviewed are the following: 15 men and 4 women; 6 at US institutions; 3 at UK institutions; 1 each from France, Germany, Israel; 1 independent scholar; 6 at Canadian institutions (Alberta; McGill (3); Waterloo; York).

Among the reviewers of the books are the following: 12 men and 3 women; 4 at US institutions; 2 at UK and French institutions; 1 each from Greece and Israel; 4 at Canadian institutions (Laval; UBC; U of Toronto; York); and 1 Independent Scholar (from Canada).

There are three French language reviews.

3.2 *Phoenix*, vol. 72.1-2

We expect this issue to be published soon, with 17 reviews that cover the following areas: Greek literature (1); Greek philosophy (2); Roman Period Literature (2); Roman History (6); Material Culture (4); Reception (2) Among the authors and editors of the books reviewed are the following: 7 men and 11 women; 8 at US institutions; 3 at UK institutions; 2 from Italy, 1 each from Denmark, France and Switzerland; 1 at a Canadian institution (Manitoba), and 1 independent scholar (US). Among the reviewers of the books are the following: 10 men and 7 women; 3 at US institutions; 1 each from France, Greece Spain, and Switzerland; 9 at Canadian institutions (McGill; McMaster; Memorial; New Brunswick; Ottawa (2); Univ. de Montréal; U of Toronto; York), and 1 independent scholar (UK).

There are 3 French language reviews.

3.3 Future volumes

3 reviews for the next issue (72.3-4) have already been submitted; currently, we have around 40 books placed with reviewers.
