

MOUSEION REPORT FOR CAC AGM 2020



1. RECENT AND UP-COMING ISSUES.

2019 was a very active year for Mouseion with the publication of three regular issues and two supplements.

Already published

16.3 Special issue: “Aryballos I: Studies in honour of Nigel B. Crowther,” with Kevin Solez as guest editor, included six articles and six book reviews.

17 (Supplement): “Festschrift in honour of A.J. Podlecki.” Ten articles.

This supplement was supposed to be published in 2019 (originally numbered Supplement (16)3, but publication delays pushed its publication into 2020.

At the Press / In Preparation

17.1 Regular Issue. Currently at the press. Four articles; two items under “Echos du Monde Classique”; seven book reviews.

17.2 Regular Archaeology Issue. In preparation. Five articles; two items in “Echos du Monde Classique (winners of the first translation contest); six book reviews.

17.3 Regular Issue.

2. PUBLICATION SCHEDULE.

For reasons beyond our control, the production of 17.1 has been somewhat delayed. We hope, however, to have issues 17.2 and 17.3 out at their expected time.

3. VERSE TRANSLATION COMPETITION

Mouseion is running the competition again this year with a French poem by Hugo. The 2019 winners will be published in 17.2.

4. SUBMISSION RATES

Submissions have been slow but constant. In the past year there have been eight submissions. There are five submissions currently under review. Two have been accepted (one will appear in 17.1, the other in 17.3), four are still out for review, two were “revise and resubmit”, of which one has just been resubmitted. Five submissions (two accepted, two resubmitted, one rejected) were received in the archaeology stream. Altogether, eight men

and five women made submissions. Three were Canadian, three Spanish, three American and one each from Germany, Turkey, Greece and Italy.

5. *MOUSEION* COLLOQUIUM

On November 15 and 16, 2019, *Mouseion* and Saint Mary's University hosted an international colloquium on the social significance of Roman imperial estates in Italy. Eight presenters, both archaeologists and ancient historians, came from other parts of Canada, the United States, the UK, and Italy for the two-day event. The goal is to produce an edited volume on the social significance of imperial estates and properties in Roman Italy with respect to structuring social, economic, and religious organization in the Roman countryside. Participants met on the 16th to discuss the volume, came up with a preliminary table of contents, and will submit abstracts to the editors, Myles McCallum and Jason Farr, at the end of March, 2020. Drafts of articles are due in the fall of 2020. In addition to the eight presenters, two others, from La Sapienza in Rome and Columbia University, who were unable to attend the colloquium will submit abstracts and each contribute an article, for a total of 10.

6. FINANCES

Dr. Allen is currently working on *Mouseion's* financial report and we expect them to be ready in time for the AGM. After about two years of waiting, *Mouseion* received financial statements from the University of Toronto Press on March 6th. From first appearances, *Mouseion* is in good shape.
