

MOUSEION REPORT FOR CAC AGM 2021

May 26, 2021



1. RECENT AND UP-COMING ISSUES.

17.2 Regular Archaeology Issue. Published April 2021. Five articles plus the report of the Canadian Institute in Greece for 2017; one item in “Echos du Monde Classique” (the Latin winner of the first translation contest); six book reviews.

17.3 Regular Issue. At the press. Three articles; two review articles; three items in “Echos du Monde Classique”; eight book reviews. Author’s proofs have been sent to the authors.

18.1 Special Issue. Report on the site of Eleon. Guest editors Brendan Burke and Bryan Burns; six book reviews.

18.2 Regular Archaeology Issue.

18.3 Regular Issue. Two articles are lined up for this issue.

2. PUBLICATION SCHEDULE.

We expect to send the files for 18.1 to the press in the second week of May. The files for 18.2 will go at the end of July. We hope that 18.3 will be sent not long after 18.2 and that we will be back on track with volume 19.

3. SUBMISSION AND ACCEPTANCE RATES

Between May 2020 and late April 2021, Mouseion received 12 “regular” submissions. Of these five are from Canada, two from the US, two from Italy and one each from Greece, Ukraine and Great Britain. Of these, six are still in process, three have been accepted, and three have been rejected. Of seven submissions, which were received before May 2020 but upon which no decision had been made before the last AGM, two were accepted, one was “revise and resubmit” and four were rejected.

Myles McCallum has received four archaeological submissions (although another is expected). Of these one was accepted, one was “revise and resubmit” and two were rejected. This rate is lower than normal and may be due to the lack of fieldwork last year.

4. *MOUSEION* COLLOQUIUM

Ten papers based on the colloquium held at Saint Mary’s University in November 2019 are now due in June 2021.

5. ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION SYSTEM

The editors met with Antonia Pop of the Press before Christmas to discuss an electronic submission system for the journal. The proposal seems excellent to the editors and will facilitate the refereeing process greatly. We have begun working to set the system up. The editors will make an announcement on the CAC News Page when the system is ready to launch.

6. CHANGE IN BOARD MEMBERSHIP

Guy Chamberlain has resigned from the editorial board of *Mouseion*. He has served both as the editor for French language submissions and for Roman history (more recently for Roman history alone). The editors will miss his good humour and his good sense and thank him for his long service on the editorial board.
